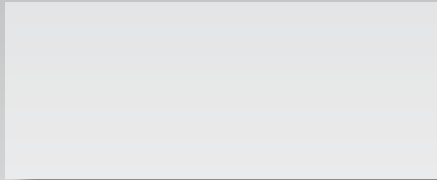

The Association for Surface Chemistry Research, FYF*, invites you to join us for FYF Member Days 2010. This year's theme is **Sustainable Research and Innovation**: we will explore how a cleantech perspective can drive business opportunities in both new and well-established industries.

Our keynote speaker, Professor Kevin Noone, will lay the foundation for the Member Days' discussions by presenting results supporting the need for **planetary boundaries**, and a safe operating space for humanity. Noone is a globally recognized scientist in the field of atmospheric chemistry and physics, the effects of aerosols and clouds on air quality and the Earth's climate. He currently has joint appointments at the Department of Applied Environmental Science and the Stockholm Resilience Centre at Stockholm University, and he is also the Director of the Global Environmental Change Secretariat at the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences.

Taking things further you will learn how to handle **global challenges** in connection with the ever-increasing amounts of **waste** produced by developed and developing societies. "Waste Refinery", a competence centre hosted by SP, will present their studies on optimum conversion of waste material into high-quality products.


There will be a number of industrial **success stories** to take inspiration from:

- **AkzoNobel** creates value from Eco premium solutions.
- **Billerud** contributes to reducing problems with accumulating plastic waste in the environment developing bio plastics for packaging.
- **ClimateWell** creates new business on their invention for "Solar cooling".


YKI break-through research in the field of applied surface chemistry and its relevance for cleantech will also be presented with specific focus on interfacial materials for cleantech applications, sustainable formulation and smart coatings. As always, there will be plenty of time for meeting peers from industry as well as colleagues from YKI and our partners.
